2.75 (a) (1) (iii)

RECORDS: DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS.

Section 2.75(a)(1)(iii) states "Each exhibitor shall make, keep, and maintain records or forms which fully and correctly disclose the following information concerning each dog purchased or otherwise acquired, owned, held, or otherwise in his possession or under his control, or which is transported, euthanized, sold, or otherwise disposed of by that exhibitor. Records are to include name, address, and the vehicle license number and State, and the driver's license number (or photographic identification card for nondrivers issued by a State) and State of the person, if he or she is not licensed or registered under the Act."

The last three dogs obtained (all in 2010 and 2011) were from private individuals and the driver's license numbers and license plate numbers were not obtained for these people. If possible this information needs to be acquired and is to be acquired for all future acquisitions.

2.75 (b) (1) (iii)

RECORDS: DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS.

Section 2.75(b)(1)(iii) states "Every exhibitor shall make, keep, and maintain records or forms which fully and correctly disclose the following information concerning animals other than dogs and cats, purchased or otherwise acquired, owned, held, leased, or otherwise in his possession or under his control, or which is transported, sold, euthanized, or otherwise disposed of by that exhibitor. Records are to include the name, address, and the vehicle license number and State, and the driver's license number (or photographic identification card for nondrivers issued by a State) and State of the person, if he or she is not licensed or registered under the Act."

All four capuchins were acquired from private individuals and the driver's license numbers and license plate numbers were not obtained for these people. The most recent acquisition was 9-6-11. If possible this information needs to be acquired and is to be acquired for all future acquisitions.

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3.80 (b) (2) (i)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Section 3.80(b)(2)(i) states "Primary enclosures for nonhuman primates must meet the following minimum requirements: The minimum space that must be provided to each nonhuman primate, whether housed individually or with other nonhuman primates, will be determined by the typical weight of animals of its species. Capuchins weighing 2.2 - 6.6 pounds require a minimum of 3 square feet of floor space each."

A new capuchin was acquired on 9-6-11, and is being housed with one of the other capuchins in a cage providing 3.8 square feet of floor space. Since each capuchin requires 3 square feet of floor space, they need to be in an enclosure with a minimum of 6 square feet of floor space. The minimum floor space needs to be provided all non-human primates. To be corrected by 11-5-11.

ENVIRONMENT ENHANCEMENT TO PROMOTE PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING.

Section 3.81(c)(4) states "Special considerations. Certain nonhuman primates must be provided special attention regarding enhancement of their environment, based on the needs of the individual species and in accordance with the instructions of the attending veterinarian. Nonhuman primates requiring special attention are the following. Individually housed nonhuman primates that are unable to see and hear nonhuman primates of their own or compatible species."

Two of the capuchins are individually housed to where they cannot see the other primates due to the cage designs and configuration. If the capuchins are not going to be socially housed, either the cages can be moved or a mirror placed to provide visualization of another capuchin. To be corrected by 10-14-11.
